Howard Lowy, M.D.

Director, NSMC Magnetic Imaging
Dr. Lowy attended Oberlin College in Ohio, and received his medical degree from University of Pittsburgh, School of Medicine. He did his diagnostic radiology residency at Brigham and Women's Hospital. Upon completion of a 2 year neuro-radiology fellowship at Massachusetts General Hospital in June 1986, Dr. Lowy became a senior member of the American Society of Neuroradiology. He has held leadership positions in the field of MRI since 1986, and served as Clinical Director at North Shore Magnetic Imaging Center since 1998. In addition to his skills and focus in neuroradiology, Dr. Lowy has an interest in musculoskeletal MRI, and has directed his continuing education in that area.

Dr. Roig received her medical degree from Ponce School of Medicine in Ponce, Puerto Rico.
